# **PASTORAL PONDERINGS**

When I am driving, I enjoy listening to books on CD. I am not too fussy about what stories I listen to since I "thrift" them and my only criteria is "nothing violent and it must cost under \$2.00." A few weeks back I was listening to a mystery, that was dull, but I was sticking with it. When I heard "please insert disc number nine," I panicked. I had no disc 9. When I purchased the CD, it had been taped shut and now I discovered "Disc 9? there was no disc 9," which contained the end of the story! As soon as I got home, I went on the computer to find a "spoiler" for the book (an article that tells the ending of the book.) Twenty-five entries later and still, no clue how the story ended. I felt frustration at never getting to know who did it.

We are not very good at living with mystery. We have not been raised to cultivate a sense of mystery. We are people of problem solving and facts. We work hard to solve the mysteries we encounter and may even see the unknown as an insult to our competence; a personal failing.

Perhaps that is why it is such a struggle for us to give ourselves over to the Divine Mystery that makes up our Catholic Faith. The Divine Mystery requires that we listen and become open. When we meet with the unknown in this way, we can be touched by wisdom that can transform our lives. I remember one of my theology professors. His favorite line when his students would begin to push for "facts" was "It's a mystery." (As a sideline that worked. I remember one exam when we were to expound on some theological issue, and I ventured with "It's a mystery." I got full credit for the answer.)

The most profound mystery of our faith is centered on Jesus Christ, in whom we move and live and have our being. This mystery of the God man, come among us, is so great that when the Roman Missal was revised a few years back, <u>the gesture of bowing within the Creed at the words of Incarnation was reinstated</u>. Why? Certainly, not to put us through little liturgical calisthenics, but rather to humble us mere mortals at the enormity of what God, in love, does for us.

At the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer the priest proclaims, "The Mystery of Faith" and again we joyfully respond knowing this mystery is not like something out of Agatha Christie or a puzzle to be solved, but a reality that we accept in faith because we cannot possibly comprehend it just by reason.

That same spirit of humility and awe should overtake us as we move forward to receive the Eucharist. Again, the bow, the audible "Amen" as we realize we are about to receive so great a mystery, so incomprehensible a mystery, so magnificent a mystery, that we can only bow in humility and sheer awe before Jesus.



When we speak of the *mystery* of Jesus Christ, we must also acknowledge that human life itself is a mystery. We are not just flesh and bone, mind, and body, but we are soul and spirit, carrying the very breath of God within us. When was the last time you bowed before that mystery within yourself?

Let us continue to stand in awe and humility before Divine Mystery, knowing that while our story is far from ended, we can live in hope and trust, because Disc #9 is firmly and safely held in the hand of God.


