

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

The next three weeks we will be celebrating the scrutinies with our elect. Jesus calls us to live a certain way. Loving God and loving neighbor is the basis for scrutinizing our choices. To scrutinize, in this context, is to look carefully at the things we do and how we feel after our decision. The rites called the scrutinies "are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good" (RCIA 141). During these scrutinies, the elect look within themselves to identify anything that is keeping them from Christ and then to repent. They look to Christ to heal them and strengthen them when they face temptations.

The elect will be reflecting upon three Gospel stories that reveal the meaning of their upcoming baptism and the process of conversion. In spiritual terms conversion is "the ongoing response of our whole person turning in faith and love to the God who loves us." Conversion is more than a decision to choose right from wrong or good over evil. Morality and law do not save. God does. Receiving the free gift, or grace, of God's love and mercy makes true morality, which is choosing to follow God's will out of love and not fear, possible.

To follow is a summary of the Gospels for the upcoming weeks with reflection questions. We can all spend time with these as we labor for spiritual renewal during Lent. When there are elect in a parish who are moving toward full communion with the Catholic Church <u>the Gospel readings used are those from Liturgical Year A</u>.

- **1st Scrutiny:** Christ as Living Water (John 4:5-42) In this Gospel story of Jesus meeting a Samaritan woman at a well, Jesus speaks to her of living water.
 - Thirst brings the Samaritan woman to a well that cannot really satisfy. Thirst brings Jesus to the well, too, as he has a thirst for souls. How do Jesus' words to the Samaritan woman give life to you?
 - How thirsty are you for Christ's living water? What dryness in your life do you hope it will quench?
- **2nd Scrutiny:** Christ as the Light of the World (John 9:1-41) In this Gospel story of Jesus healing a man who was born blind, Jesus refers to himself as the light of the world.
 - When have you been "blind" or unwilling to see the light of Christ? What had your attention and kept you from seeing?
 - Who or what has helped you gain new vision to recognize Christ as the light?
 - What blindness (sin) do you want this time of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer to wash away?
- **3rd Scrutiny:** Christ as the Resurrection and the Life (John 11:1-45) In this Gospel story of Jesus raising his friend Lazarus back to life, Jesus calls himself the resurrection and the life.
 - What does the promise of eternal life with God mean to you?
 - How have you received new life through your relationship with Jesus?

During the 1st Scrutiny the elect will be <u>presented with the Creed</u> to help them prepare to profess their faith on the day of their baptism. During the 3rd Scrutiny the elect will be <u>presented with the Lord's Prayer</u>. The presentation of the Lord's prayer "prepares the elect to make the prayer their own as they join the congregation in praying it prior to their first Eucharist." (RCIA 149)

Please continue to pray for our <u>elect and candidates</u> as they continue their journey of coming into full communion with the Catholic Church. Consider dropping a card of encouragement in the basket by the poster board in Marian Hall in Omro or the main entrance in Winneconne. They will receive your cards at the Easter Vigil.


