PASTORAL PONDERINGS

A parish is more than a building of stone—it is meant to be a home built of living stones. Through Baptism, we are not merely names on a parish roster. We become sons and daughters of the Father and brothers and sisters in Christ. For that reason, a parish must be more than a place we go; it must become a family to which we truly belong.

Consider the image of a garden. A garden cannot flourish if every plant is kept in its own pot, carefully separated from the others. Growth happens in shared soil, under the same sun, tended by the same gardener. In the same way, God has planted each of us in this parish community. We receive the same Eucharistic nourishment, hear the same Word, and are cared for by the same Divine Gardener. But for real growth to occur, our roots must intertwine.

Holiness is never a solitary project. We grow in patience as we bear with one another's weaknesses. We grow in charity as we meet real needs. And we grow in mercy as we learn to forgive. When we take time to know each other's stories, struggles, and gifts, we create the conditions where goodness and love can take root and flourish.

A parish family prays together, supports one another in suffering, celebrates joys, and gently calls each other higher. When we genuinely know and love one another, we help each other on the journey to heaven—which is the true purpose of our life together in Jesus Christ.

We all have an opportunity to continue growing as a parish family through the upcoming Discipleship Small Group experience that begins Tuesday, February 24th. This is a wonderful way to deepen our relationships and strengthen our faith. PASTORAL PONDERINGS BY LYN

It's almost Lent — AGAIN! Somehow this season has a way of sneaking up on us. It feels like only a few weeks ago that I finally scrubbed off the last trace of that 2025 Ash Wednesday smudge Deacon Paul traced on off my forehead. (Brace yourself — his “thumb of repentance” means business.)

So, it is almost Lent...AGAIN! But maybe that sense of déjà vu is exactly the point. Lent returns every year not to bore us, but to bless us. It's our built-in “do-over” season — a holy reset button when God gently invites us to look at our priorities, clear away the clutter, and open ourselves to grace. Lent is full of contradictions: penitential joy, quiet renewal, solemn hope, all part of holy transformation.

Still, if we're honest, many of us approach Lent the same way every year. We give up the same things, say the same prayers, and hope for a slightly better outcome. So how do we step out of the “Lent on repeat” mindset and enter these 40 days with fresh eyes?

Start small — smaller than you think. God delights in tiny beginnings: a single daily prayer, a moment of silence before the day starts, one act of kindness that brightens someone's afternoon. Small steps create space for grace to slip in quietly.

Add something good. Instead of only giving something up, consider adding a practice that nourishes your spirit — a gratitude list, a short Scripture reading, a daily walk where you intentionally look for signs of God in the ordinary.

Let yourself laugh. Truly. Humor loosens the knots in our spirits and helps us see God more clearly. Lent is serious, but it's not somber. A light heart can be a doorway to deeper trust. Walk these 40 days gently. Some days you'll feel inspired; other days you'll wonder why you ever thought giving up coffee was a good idea.

That's all part of the pilgrimage. God walks every step with you — steady, patient, delighted by every effort, no matter how small.

So yes, Lent is almost here... again. But maybe “again” is not a sigh — maybe it's an invitation. Another chance. Another opening. Another season where God whispers, “Let's begin anew.”

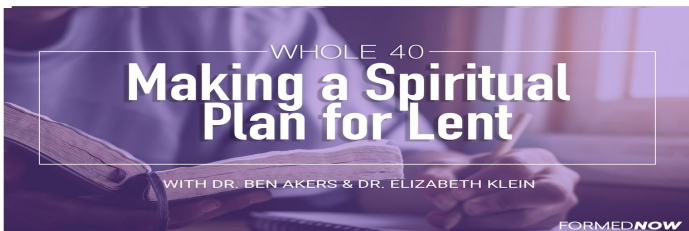
