

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

It's Tuesday morning, July 11. The United States weather service has declared we are in a drought, with most of Wisconsin being 2-4" short of usual rainfall, so as I read the readings for this Sunday, they were poignant. We pray with the prophet Isaiah for rains to come down and water the earth.

Have you ever found yourself in a time of spiritual drought? At times our sense of a spiritual life can be strong and vibrant. Other times our hearts feel like lead weights, and we find ourselves longing for God to rain grace upon our soul and bring refreshment.

Some indicators of spiritual drought can be 1) Finding in yourself a lack of generosity. We are no longer giving to others out of a sense of fullness and focus more on what we don't have. 2) We no longer find joy in attending Mass or being part of the Christian Community. There is a reluctance to attend Mass and a resistance to serve, but we continue to do so because we feel we have no choice. 3) We are not joy filled. People are not seeing something in us that causes them to thirst for God, and we lack the motivation to share with them; feeling we have nothing to offer. 4) God feels distant. We lack the excitement we once had in our relationship with God and our encountering has either been reduced to a rote exercise, is occasional, or has ceased to exist at all. A final indicator of spiritual drought can be realizing life events have pulled us further from God rather than bringing God closer. We worry about and expend so much energy on finances, dealing with sickness and death, the loss of family, friends or material possessions, seeing others prosper as we struggle; leaving us in a negative place where peace and joy—seem to evade us.

A spiritual drought has been a struggle we've all most likely faced. I've struggled with an occasional spiritual drought of my own and know firsthand how dangerous it can be. But I also know how amazing it can be to come out better than you went in. That is what I hope for you; not to lose faith in the midst of a spiritual drought but to dig into it, learn from it and move out of it.

Begin by making attending Mass on Sunday a joyful priority in your life.

Be intentional about sharing your burdens. Realize these are not yours to carry alone, seek out spiritual support companions. Do not be afraid. Have you become indifferent to the Mass or the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Talk to a priest or Deacon Paul. They will not judge you; they find great joy in knowing that you have rekindled your love in Jesus. Perhaps you desire someone to walk with you a little longer. Our parish provides, as a service to you, Spiritual Companionship. In this practice you meet Lyn Zahorik who is trained in Spiritual Companionship. Meetings last for an hour; usually monthly. Together you pray, reflect on your life, laugh, cry and explore the beauty and potential God holds for your life.

Set time aside to attend one of the many Adult Spiritual Formation programs given within our parish.

Live quiet moments in your life by reading scripture or a spiritual book, going on a walk in nature, sitting and listening to Christian music or falling asleep at night counting your blessings. Believe and trust - God is the only answer that can lead us out of our own suffering; out of our own season of drought. God will pull you out. Let God show you the way.

The most encouraging words I can give are these:

"The Lord will guide you continually, satisfy your soul in drought, and strengthen your bones. You shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail." (Isaiah 58:11)






