# **PASTORAL PONDERINGS**

Jesus of Nazareth invites you to a meal in His honor

I find one of the joys of life is gathering over a good meal of delicious food and uplifting conversation. Dining with Jesus is the most intimate meal in which we can share. As I have grown in my own relationship with Jesus, I have begun to realize my different needs in Eucharistic dining preferences.

Most of the time when I am at Mass, I am the Brunch kind of person. I like variety in the music, combinations of the contemporary and the traditional rituals, moments of silence and times of singing and speaking out with the rest of the Community.

I also look forward to the Masses that are Fine Dining, such as Christmas, Easter, Pentecost and other high feasts that call for my "dress up for church" clothes. These are the Masses that are "high church," with all the bells and smells. We get to participate in elaborate processions, smell the wafting incense and immerse ourselves in elaborate environments. Just like Thanksgiving is not Thanksgiving without the special turkey stuffing, that was great grandmother's recipe being served, so too, these Masses carry traditions that have been part of the church for centuries; and should not be forgotten.

And then, there are times I simply enjoy a picnic. I come to Mass to be with the Community, to share smiles and hugs, and to be casual. Receiving Jesus in the Eucharist is what matters most to me. If everything else is simple, but done nicely, I'm content.

I must admit, there have been a few times when I was a snacker. Snackers slip into the pew just in time for the Gospel and leave immediately after Communion. Their life is always on the run. Snacks are short term treats; they will never fill us with the grace that comes from making time to savor the Eucharist.

In the past years a new trend emerging among the Healthy Living Lifestyle groups, is the use of Intermittent Fasting. The claim is that intermittent fasting improves your general health, lowers cholesterol and improves heart function. When it comes to Jesus in the Eucharist, the only fasting to even consider, is the one hour that the Church asks us to fast from food and drink before receiving Eucharist. As an aside, there are people who feel this fast is a burden and that if they are attending, for instance, a 10 AM Mass, eating or drinking nothing after 9:00 AM can easily be forgotten and the fast broken. We need to pay attention to what the rule is asking of us...60 minutes of fasting <u>before receiving</u> Eucharist. The reception of Eucharist usually happens approximately 40 minutes into the Eucharist. Factor in your travel time to Church (with no drive-through restaurant stops) and for most of us, we have easily kept the one hour fast.

Intermittent Fasting from the Sunday (Saturday Vigil) Liturgy DOES NOT have any spiritual benefit for us. Our heart connection with Jesus is not strengthened, nor do we gain any of the graces and spiritual support of praying with the gathered Assembly. Please do not allow yourself to slip into the mode of "I will attend Sunday Mass whenever it works out in my schedule." Attending Mass on Sunday should be a joy, a privilege, a priority. *Jesus of Nazareth invites you to a meal in His honor*. Don't let this invitation pass you by, because if you do, you are missing out on a meal that is simply out of this world! Lyn Zahorik


