# PASTORAL PONDERINGS

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity this weekend, let's reflect upon how God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit—three in one; has been and continues to reveal himself to us.

Where should we begin? God is sooo good! He knows our humanity well and gifts us with the liturgical calendar. His great GPS keeps us on the highway to heaven. Whether you have a knack for directions or not, I think it is fair to say, we ALL need the help of God's GPS to avoid detours, wrong turns, and the temptation to choose the wrong path when we get lost.



Let's start with Advent, which is the beginning of the Church year. **Advent** 

provides us with a gentle, quiet season of fasting and contemplation while Christians wait for the arrival of Jesus. The spirit of Advent brings an awareness that God the Father is always present, that Jesus is near, that the Spirit is at hand. Advent celebrates the continuous intervention of God in the history of the world and in our lives.

The liturgical season of **Christmas** is next. It begins with the celebration of Jesus' birth and incarnation. It concludes with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which is observed on the first Sunday after January 6. As we celebrate the birth of our savior each year, we experience great joy and renewal. Jesus reveals our heavenly Father's loving plan for us. The Father looks at us in our sin and instead of giving up on us, he gives us his Son, Jesus, our savior, who never tires of us seeking his forgiveness and mercy and gifting us with new life. God is sooo good!

When Jesus is baptized by John, he comes up from the waters, and the heavens break open and the Holy Spirit descends upon him like a dove. The Father makes a public declaration of Jesus' identity, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." (Mark 1:10-11). From that point, Jesus is powered by the Spirit and love of God. The great news is the same Spirit that Jesus received now rests on anyone who follows him. In our baptism, we become adopted children of the Father, members of the Church, the Body of Christ, and temples of the Holy Spirit. Baptism washes away our original sin, claims us for the kingdom of God, and sends us on mission as disciples.

Next, we enter into the part of the Christian year called **Ordinary Time** in which we celebrate the life and teachings of Jesus Christ and what it means to be his disciple. Ordinary Time is divided into two parts. The first falls between Christmas and Lent. It is a time to go deeper into our faith.

*Lent* is next. It is 40 days and begins on Ash Wednesday. During Lent we remember the events leading up to and including Jesus' death on the cross. We pray, give alms, and fast in order to grow closer to Jesus and to one another. It is a time to reflect on what it means to be a follower of Christ.

"**Easter** is the most important liturgical time for Catholics. It celebrates Jesus' victory over sin and death and brings salvation to mankind. It is God's greatest act of love to redeem mankind." The Easter season is a 50 day celebration!

Pentecost brings Easter to a conclusion and brings the Holy Spirit to us! The Holy Spirit empowers us to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit brings order to chaos. "Come Holy Spirit. Bring me your peace."

As we are entering the second season of **Ordinary Time**, which happens between the seasons of <u>Easter and Advent</u>, we are once again called to contemplate Jesus' teachings and works among his people. Jesus reveals himself to us in all seasons and in all times! He came to bring peace. He came to heal the sick. He came to minister to the needy. He came to show us the way, the truth and the life! Let us continue to pay attention to the many ways God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit reveals himself to us every day. Let us stay connected to His perfect GPS and help others follow our lead in thought, word, and action, just as the early Christians have done for us!


