PASTORAL PONDERINGS

There is nothing I enjoy more than reading a good book, cover to cover. Actually, that is not true, what I enjoy most is going to rummage sales, where I find good books to read.

For the past six weeks we have had the opportunity to hear, once again, the greatest story ever told: that of the life, passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The prologue of our story began on Holy Thursday. Chapter one began at the Easter Vigil. Seldom is the climax of a story revealed in chapter one, but as we lit candles, blessed Holy Water, sang Alleluias, rang bells, burnt incense and shared Eucharist, there it was, the essence of the story.

During these weeks since the Vigil, the story has continued by recounting for us the days the Resurrected Jesus lived among us until the day of his Ascension. Jesus spent all that time encouraging, inspiring, and affirming the good news that He had planted in the hearts of all his followers.

In a few weeks we will celebrate the great feast of Pentecost. This feast is the compliment "bookend" to the Easter Vigil and challenges us to affirm the Holy Spirt within ourselves, to live out the epilogue; our rest of the story, as people with the passion to care, the power to speak, and the boldness to move as a person of Spirit in a secular world. Pentecost sets our hearts on fire and enables us to share the unquenchable love of God and the awe of living in and through Jesus, who is making all things new.

Pentecost is the twin of the Easter Vigil. Prior to Vatican II (remember there were no Saturday evening Masses at that time) the community would gather on the Eve of Pentecost to celebrate Mass. Like the Easter vigil, where up to nine readings from scripture were read to contemplate the presence of Christ's Paschal mystery throughout salvation history, the Vigil of Pentecost contained seven readings, with an emphasis on the working of the Holy Spirit. Each reading was separated by the singing of a psalm. While many Monastic communities today still maintain the Pentecost Vigil in their worship, most parish communities use only the Mass for Pentecost Sunday itself.

What can you hope to experience when you attend Mass at St. Mary on Pentecost, May27/28? Smells, bells, color and flames! Mirroring the Easter Vigil, a small amount of incense will be used at the beginning of Mass and at the offertory. The Assembly will be invited to ring bells during the Gloria. The flame of the Paschal Candle which represents Christ among us, will be used to light the brazier which will be our fire of the people. As the Alleluia flag was carried on Easter our Pentecost banner will be carried in procession at the Masses and the Universal Prayers will make note of the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit (can you name all of them?)

Please make a reminder to yourself to add to the beauty of the day by wearing something RED to Mass that day.




