PASTORAL PONDERINGS

Over the years, my daughter Alexis and I have formed a tradition of going on adventures together. This year's was climbing a mountain! Yes, a 14er and even though it is one of the easier, less technical fourteener's to climb, it was far from a walk in the park. This adventure brought the transfiguration of Jesus to life for me through the following spiritual lessons.

1. Be as prepared as you can and be open to what unfolds.

Peter, James and John, trusted Jesus and followed him. Alexis had climbed before, and it was through her wisdom of taking a couple days to acclimate to the elevation, to hydrate, and to have a well packed backpack for the big day that we were well prepared on the morning of the climb. In addition, like Peter, James and John, I trusted that Jesus knew where he was taking us!

2. Take breaks when needed regardless of the pace of others.

We started early in the morning with lots of energy and the excitement of the journey filled our hearts. Yet, it was not too long before we realized that many breaks would be needed throughout this adventure. I must admit there were times when I thought "what did I get myself into?" In these moments, Jesus kindly reminded me not only to be patient physically but also spiritually, for He is the one leading each one of us on our journey to that mountain top where we will be transfigured.

3. Be grateful in the midst of the journey—for the beauty, as well as the pain.

My daughter and I have a good relationship and we also have things we do not agree on. In the midst of our differences, as we climbed that mountain, there was a sense of gratitude for the gift of each other, the gift of walking through our differences and choosing to love one another. Climbing that mountain reminded me the road is not always easy and there are times we are afraid, but it is walking through the pain and fear with JESUS that makes the journey beautiful.


4. Take one rock at a time. The struggle is worth it.

As we rose above the tree line and got to a false summit, we were able to see we still had a LONG way to go. Despite feeling a bit overwhelmed, we were able to laugh and rest and begin again with hope and a conviction to complete the journey. There were times that I felt like I couldn't go on but I imagined Jesus telling me, as he may have Peter, James and John, "Come on Rosemary, don't be afraid. You can climb one more rock." So I did, one rock at a time and that led to the top of the mountain where my daughter and I celebrated in God's magnificent glory! I did not want to leave. "Lord it is good that we are here." Time stopped. The beauty took my breath away, ok so did the climbing! In that moment, I came to understand, mountain top experiences would be empty without grace and love!

5. Mountain top experiences can happen in ordinary time.

On the way down the mountain, there was the realization that our adventure was coming to an end, a joy for what we experienced, and the reality of having to go back to the ordinary routine of life. The day we returned


home, as Alexis and I were saying goodbye, there was a hug that was eternal. It was a grace from God. A time a mother was able to hold her grown daughter as she did when she was an infant in her arms. Another mountain top experience in the midst of the ordinary! A transfiguration of hearts. God is sooo good! May we all become more aware of the extraordinary in the ordinary and the beauty in the adventure!



Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." 


